KERBY—Mr. and Mrs. Don North plan to move to Cave Junction and rent their Kerby home.

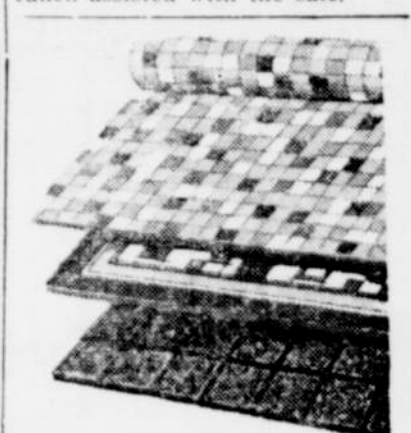

Re-elect Congressman Ellsworth. He will continue to apply experience, judgment, ability and devotion to the duties of the office.

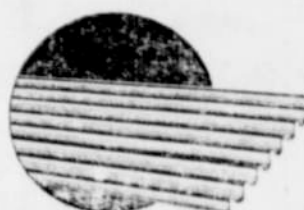

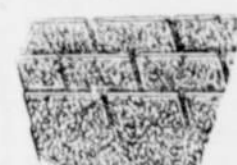
