"The Five Baptisms."

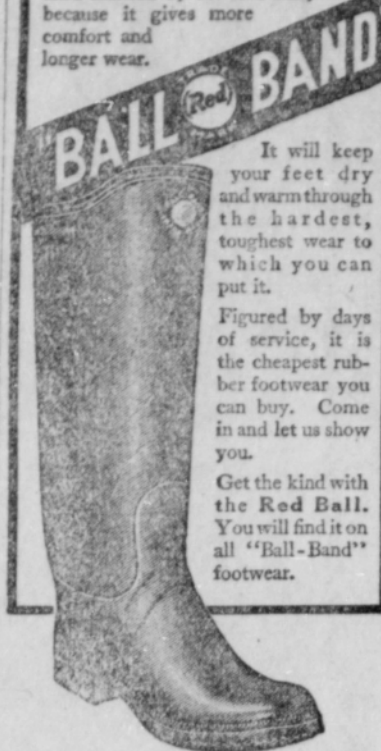
This will be the first announced discussion on the theme of Baptism. Five Baptisms—can you name them?
