Farmer Raises Big Crop Beans

Albany Herald: To raise a crop that more than pays for the land in one year seems like a dream, and no doubt raises the price of the land, but Mr. M. V. Merrill, of Murphy's Seed Store, reports an instance in which the price of the crop was much more than the price of the land. He was at Harrisburg yesterday and shipped 13,000 pounds of beans, the crop of one farmer living 10 miles from Harrisburg. It was the crop of J. C. Warner, and was the first bean crop on the place. The yield was more than 30 bushels to the acre. Beans weigh 60 pounds to the bushel and are now selling for about 8 cents, which is about double the normal price. This can be figured out very easily to be a very large price for cheap foothill land.

Murphy has bought and shipped more than two cars of beans from Albany this season and says the bean crop is to be much larger in the county this year.
