An Explanation About the Creamery

The Enterprise was requested by Mr. Quinn, who is working here on the proposed creamery, to give out the following in this week's issue.

The editor knows of creamery plants that Mr. Quinn has constructed for the people in different places that are doing well and the stockholders pleased and satisfied. We have in mind the plants at Cottonwood, Idaho, the Mutual Creamery, at Tonasket, Wash., and the White River Creamery at Kent, Wash.

The editor of The Enterprise has no interest in the matter other than to encourage any worthy industry in our midst that will be a benefit to the community at large. This we know a good creamery will be and we think the plan and proposition as embodied in the contract which has been signed by several of our leading citizens is very reasonable and fair in its conditions. However, it's up to each one of our citizens to judge for himself.

Proposed Creamery Plan Explained.

The creamery building and machinery installed ready for successful operation, a competent and experienced butter maker placed here for the operation of the creamery. If necessary, a reliable market found for the product, all for the sum of \$4840. This includes the entire expense of organization, getting the capital subscribed and collected, securing pledges of sufficient number of cows to operate successfully. Machinery all new and of the most modern types manufactured by the Creamery Package Mfg. Co.

The value of the shares are to be \$100.00, subscribed in the vicinity of Halsey and no outside capital interested. The plan is to be co-operative; that is, all money from products sold to be

divided pro-rata among the producers after the running expenses are paid.

This gives the producer all there is in the business.

The over-run of 20 to 25 per cent—a saving here of at least \$1000 in transportation, and the value of the butter-milk, which, under present conditions, is shipped freight paid and donated to the other factory.

It will, no doubt, be in the by-laws, to pay all stockholders not over 8 percent at the discretion of the board of directors. Also to put 1 cent a pound butter fat into a sinking fund to pay back the stockholders on their investment as the fund accumulates, which would no doubt be at least \$1000 a year here with the amount of business in sight. On this plan the stockholder would not only get interest on his investment but would have that investment returned to him and still own his interest in the creamery.

Halsey territory is already producing enough cream to make a splendid success and there is no better location for this enterprise in the state.

The Price.

It is being contended by some who favor the creamery that the price is excessive. The writer makes this statement, that with the encouragement and help of the progressive citizens he succeeds in getting the necessary amount subscribed, and the stockholders feel and decide they want the contract to come under competitive bids they can do so by paying him a commission of 13 1-2 percent for the entire work of organization.

The subscribers for stock can give their notes for any reasonable length of time at a low rate of interest which should enable a number to take stock that probably wouldn't do so if they had to pay cash at once.

More than \$1000 has been subscribed and the present opportunity to land this enterprise is one the citizens of Halsey should not let escape.
