Oregon's Executive Urges All Qualified Young Men to Enlist During Period.

Salem, March 21.—Governor Withycombe today proclaimed the week beginning March 25 as "Patriotic Week" throughout Oregon. He points out the great need for men of the national guard and urges all qualified young men to enlist as a means of showing their loyalty.

The governor in one paragraph says: "I urge all young men to fulfill the obligations of our national citizenship by rallying to the flag, thus setting an example worthy of our best traditions and indicative of their certain continuance."

The governor expresses confidence in the loyalty of the citizens of the state and urges them to give serious consideration to national problems.

Saves Eggs

SPONGE CAKE

1 cup sugar
1/2 cup water
3 eggs
2 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup cold water
1 teaspoon flavoring

DIRECTIONS.—Beat sugar and water until syrup spins a thread and add to the stiffly beaten whites of eggs, beating until the mixture is cold. Sift together three times the flour, salt and baking powder; add a time flour mixture and egg yolks alternately to white of egg mixture, stirring after each addition. Add 1/4 cup cold water and flavoring. Mix lightly and bake in moderate oven one hour.

The old method called for 6 eggs and no baking powder
