President Wilson's War Program

To carry on an effective warfare against the German government, which he characterized as a natural foe to liberty, the President recommended:

Utmost practical co-operation with the governments already at war with Germany.

Extension of liberal financial credits to those governments so that our resources may be added so far as possible with theirs.

Organization and mobilization of all material resources.

Full equipment of the navy, particularly for means of dealing with submarine warfare.

An army of 500,000, based on the principle of universal liability to service; and the authorization of additional increments of 500,000 each as they are needed or can be handled in training.

Raising necessary money for the United States government so far as possible without borrowing and on the basis of equitable taxes.

All preparations, the President urged, should be made in such a way as not to check the flow of war supplies to the nations already in the field against Germany.

Measures to accomplish all these ends, the President told congress, would be presented with the best thoughts of the executive departments, which will be charged with the conduct of the war.

Teach every child to read the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. Instill into their minds respect for our courts, respect for other people's property and the spirit of freedom and independence of the individual which has made this country a leader among nations.

Make the Railroads Efficient

Following the concessions of the railroads to organized labor and the big increases given to

common labor, the railroads now ask advances in freight rates of from ten to fifteen percent.

Fairminded citizens know that with all other advances the cost of fuel, materials, lumber, steel, equipment and even higher cost of capital.

A thousand million dollars is needed in new capital to keep up the equipment of railroads, restore their tracks, enlarge their terminals, build new stations, and build needed extensions.

The newspapers talk glibly of loaning a billion or five billions of American capital to belligerent nations of Europe to destroy each other with, but have not a word to say about the needs of our transportation system.

The big cities have outgrown their yards and terminal facilities and the country has reached the stage of development where all the transcontinental railroads should be double-tracked.

With this and the greater need of saving coal and oil by using electric power comes the hostile attitude of the government toward developing the unused water powers of our country.

The Interstate commerce commission and every department of state and national government should be aroused to the need for active and friendly co-operation with our railroads to make them efficient.

Save \$500,000 a Year Taxes

The Bean bill enacted by the legislature and up to the popular vote in Oregon June 4th will put 3,000,000 acres railroad lands worth \$40,000,000 on the state and county taxrolls.

If defeated, it means that the voters of the state are in favor of relinquishing state control over this property and turn it back to the United States and enlarging federal control.

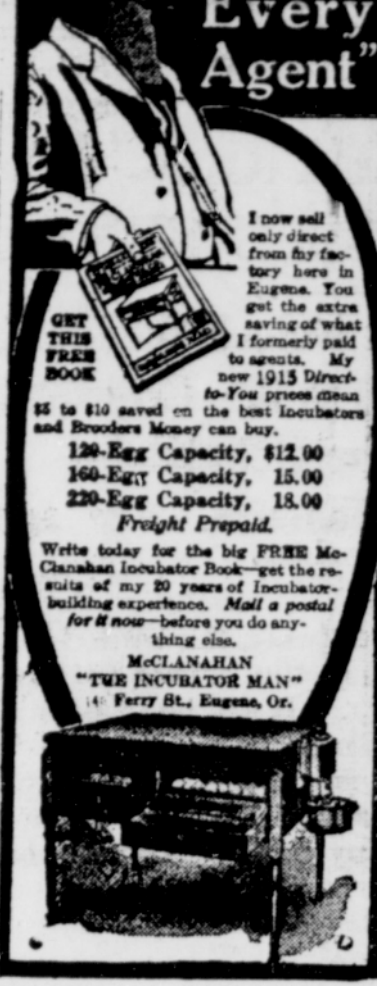
Three years back taxes are due on these lands and if the state relinquishes the right to tax and to retain its sovereignty it is very doubtful if any of those taxes due will be paid.

Federal officials have been promising for several years to pay these back taxes but have not done so, and this is the only way to force the hands of the federal government—assert the power to tax.

Douglas county would receive \$100,000 a year in taxes from these lands; Jackson county \$75,000; Lane county \$85,000, and so on, totaling more than \$500,000 to the counties in which these lands are situated.

Saves Eggs

SPONGE CAKE

1 cup sugar
1/2 cup water
3 eggs
2 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup cold water
1 teaspoon flavoring

DIRECTIONS:—Beat sugar and water until syrupy; add eggs and beat until stiffly beaten whites of eggs, beating until the mixture is cold. Sift together three times the flour, salt and baking powder; beat yolks of eggs until thick; add a little at a time flour mixture and egg yolks alternately to whites of egg mixture, stirring after each addition. Add 1/2 cup cold water and flavoring. Mix lightly and bake in moderate oven one hour.
