OREGON POTATOES

\$14,000,000

Export Total of Spuds Is
Next to Lumber for
1916.

Eugene, April 4.—Potatoes stand second only to lumber in Oregon exports, according to data compiled by Allan C. Hopkins of the University of Oregon School of Commerce for the United States department of Agriculture. In 1916, Mr. Hopkins finds, 35,791 tons of potatoes or 2386 carloads, were shipped out of the state, bringing the producer, at an average price of \$1.90 a hundred, approximately \$14,000,000. This sum as an average of \$20 each for every man, woman and child in the state.

The yield varies from 56 bushels in dry Wasco county to 200 bushels in the moist Coos county.
