Fortunately for the country there is a better understanding and stronger bonds of co-operation between capital and labor than ever before. The willingness to arbitrate differences and the spirit of concession are marked features of the times.

Saves Eggs

SPONGE CAKE

1 cup sugar
1/4 cup water
3 eggs
2 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder
1 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup cold water
1 teaspoon flavoring

DIRECTIONS:—Beat sugar and water until syrupy, spin a thread and add to the stiffly beaten whites of eggs, beating until the mixture is cold. Mix together three beat yolks of eggs until thick; add a little at a time flour mixture and egg yolks alternately to white of egg mixture, stirring after each addition. Add 1/4 cup cold water and flavoring. Mix lightly and bake in moderate oven one hour.
