Shedd Lady Hurt

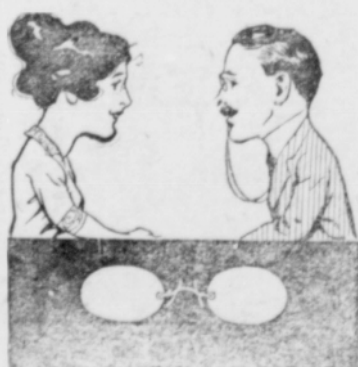
