### U BOATS WITH CUTTERS.

Heavy Circular Knives Have Been Attached to Steel Hawseers.

Base of the American Flotilla in British Waters.—The captain of a torpedoed merchantman has turned over to the naval authorities here a sketch of a new type of German submarine equipped with a wire cutting device designed to release it from nets. The sketch shows several strands of stout steel hawseers stretched from the bow through the conning tower to the stern. Attached to these is a series of heavy circular knives a foot in diameter and placed about a yard apart.

The captain made the drawing while in a small boat after his ship had been torpedoed. The theory of the captain is that a boat so equipped would have hope of being able to cut its way through any steel nets in which it might become enmeshed.
