Burned to Death

News has reached here of the death at Admiral, Saskatchewan, of Mrs. Jessie Talbot, a granddaughter of W. J. Ribelin and a daughter of William H. Ribelin. On the morning of Nov. 4 Mrs. Talbot poured some coal oil on the kitchen fire to hasten the breakfast. The can exploded, throwing burning oil over Mrs. Talbot, burning her clothing off before she could get out of doors. She died from the effects of the burns Nov. 18. She was 23 years old. The dwelling and all its contents were destroyed.

Ted Glayton, who pleaded guilty in the circuit court at Albany Friday to charges of improper conduct, was sentenced by Judge Kelley to serve an indeterminate sentence of from one to 15 years in the state penitentiary. Glayton was indicted by the Linn county grand jury last week on three different charges of misconduct.

Thrift Stamps Received

The local post office has received the first consignment of U. S. government "Thrifty Cards" and stamps, and they are now ready for distribution.

The plan used is much the same as the postal saving system. Stamps valued at 25 cents each are bought and fixed on a Thrift card. There is room for \$4 worth of stamps on the card, and when this is full a certificate is issued.

This certificate is valued at \$5 and that amount will be paid in five years by the government. The \$4 worth of thrift stamps, with a small sum added, will buy the certificate. According to the regulations, \$100 only may be deposited at one time, and one person may own but \$1000 in all.

The \$4 in stamps and 12 cents will buy a certificate during December and January, and a cent is added each month until next December, when the certificate will cost \$4.23. The government will pay, in five years, \$5 for the certificate. This is equivalent to 4 per cent compound interest.
