SIMPSON OUT

for GOVERNOR

Coos Bay Man to Make Strenuous Campaign

All doubts as to the candidacy of L. J. Simpson of North Bend for the republican nomination for governor have been set at rest. Mr. Simpson will be a candidate and in all probability a strong one.

In his announcement Mr. Simpson says: "I pledge the people of Oregon that, in conducting my campaign, I will not support any particular candidate for office in preference to the other

candidate for the same office; that I will not promise appointment to office or political patronage to anyone; that if nominated and elected I shall enter office with neither promise nor pledge to redeem, except those which I give to the people themselves."

A full and patriotic support of the national government, a rigid and uncompromising enforcement of state laws, an eight-hour day for all workers except those engaged in agriculture, an observance of strict economy in the matter of state expenditures, a comprehensive improvement and construction of roads, support of such legislation as may be necessary for the establishment of nation-wide prohibition and the permanent adoption of equal suffrage in the state and nation, an endeavor to at all times create a patriotic co-operation between employer and employee, are the notable features in Mr. Simpson's platform.

Mr. Simpson was born Sept. 1, 1877, at Oakland, Cal., and is the son of the late Capt. A. M. Simpson, the veteran lumberman.

Halsey Guard Gets Rifles

Just when it was too late to put the news in the Enterprise last week, Olin Stalnaker brought to town from Albany eight rifles for the use of the Home Guard of this city.

These rifles are a part of the lot furnished by the government for home defense purposes, and there has been some doubt as to whether it was allowable to keep them elsewhere but in a state armory, which has prevented the use of the rifles here until the present time.

Lebanon was given eleven rifles, being the only town in the county, with the exception of Halsey and Albany, to be favored with government weapons.

The Albany Democrat, in mentioning the matter, says "both Halsey and Lebanon have active organizations and are prepared to give trouble to any troublesome factions that might invade their peaceful midsts."

Signs Not Required

An order from the state public service commission is as follows: "Application having been made to this commission by the city of Halsey, Oregon, under the provisions of chapter 429 of the laws of Oregon for 1917, for relief from the obligation imposed by that statute of placing and maintaining warning signs on certain streets at their crossings at grade with the lines of the Southern Pacific company in that city; and such application having been considered and an examination of the crossings made by the commission; * * * it is ordered that the petition of the applicant in this matter be and the same is hereby granted and the city of Halsey, Oregon, is hereby relieved from the obligation of placing and maintaining advance warning signs at the crossings of the existing tracks of the Southern Pacific company on D street and at depot crossing between G and H streets in said city."
