Bert E. Haney of Portland has been recommended by Senator George E. Chamberlain for appointment as United States attorney for the district of Oregon, to succeed Clarence L. Reames, resigned.

The positive aspect of the world is contained in the President's last speech to congress as follows: "The power of the United States springs out of freedom and is for the service of freedom. The negative springs out of German tyranny and is for the service of German tyranny."

Milton A. Miller, Collector of Internal Revenue for the State of Oregon, has been notified by the treasury department at Washington, D. C., that the time for filing the 1917 Income Tax returns, including individuals and corporations, has been extended to April 1, 1918, thus giving an additional month to that provided by the war tax act of October 3, 1917. As soon as the blanks are received each corporation will be notified. Collector Miller will appreciate the early filing of returns, so that the work of his office may not be unduly congested.

Linn county people are expected to buy \$512,000 worth of war savings certificates and thrift stamps during 1918. Sales at this time amount to approximately \$37,000.

The county is being thoroughly organized and the campaign will be pushed vigorously.

P. A. Young of Albany, accompanied by Senator E. D. Cusick, was in Halsey yesterday and addressed the school children and a number of business men at a 1 o'clock meeting at the high school. The local campaign is in charge of D. S. McWilliams.
