Bede Aspires to State Senate

Cottage Grove, Ore., March 4 (Special to the Enterprise)—The newspaper endorsement which Elbert Bede of this city has received in his candidacy for the joint senatorship of Linn and Lane counties is quite remarkable. Every newspaper in Lane



county, outside of the Eugene papers, which have endorsed no one for any office, have come out strong for the Cottage Grove candidate, even including the Cottage Grove Sentinel, of which Mr. Bede is editor.

In Linn county the Brownsville Times was the first to suggest the Lane county man and it was several weeks after the endorsement of the Times that Mr. Bede announced his candidacy. Other Linn county papers which have commented favorably are the Lebanon Criterion, the Lebanon Express and even the democratic Albany Democrat, edited by the former minister to Siam. The Harrisburg Bulletin, edited by a former competitor of Mr. Bede's, was very kindly in his comment, and this occasion was the first in which Mr. Bede's name has been mentioned by Editor Conner except to hand him a few hot ones.

Unexpected endorsement has come from outside the district, from such live papers as the Gazette-Times of Corvallis, which took a column to do the subject

justice, the Forest Grove News-Times, the Tillamook Headlight and the Coos Bay Harbor.

Mr. Bede's brief platform is as follows:

"I am a candidate because I feel that I am qualified to serve the state well. I believe in saying what I think and in doing what I say. I believe in keeping my promises and will, therefore, make few of them, although I will not hesitate to say how I stand on any subject with which I am familiar. I believe that just as a public office is a public trust, so must a candidate be taken largely on trust and that one who can't be trusted to serve without making a promise on every subject likely to come before the legislature couldn't be trusted to keep the promises if he made them.

"I was born in Iowa 37 years ago, the event causing some commotion among immediate friends and relatives. I hope to be as successful in announcing my arrival at Salem. I have lived in many states of the union but am sticking to Oregon because it suits me the best of any. Among other things I have acquired during a strenuous life is a family which includes a wife and three children."

Increasing the Egg Supply.

The number of marketable eggs can be increased by following a few practical suggestions, says the United States department of agriculture. Among the most important of these are the production of the infertile egg after the breeding season is over and the proper handling of eggs by the farmer before sending them to market. The infertile egg is obtained when all male birds are removed from the flock. This does not decrease the number of eggs produced, but it does increase greatly their keeping qualities. The production of the infertile egg and the proper handling and marketing of eggs by the producer would increase tremendously the number of marketable eggs each year by diminishing the quantity that are rendered unfit for food.

Why Shortage Exists.

The three great sugar producing centers of the world are Germany, the West and East Indies. German sugar is, of course, used at home. The East Indian sugar is unavailable because of the ship shortage.

While U boats made big inroads on the world's shipping, France and Italy ceased to be self sustaining in sugar manufacture. England in the meantime was cut off from German sugar—1,500,000 tons a year—because of the war. The result has been that the allied nations have been forced to turn to America and the West Indies for their sugar.
