INSECTS AND POTATO DISEASES CAUSING BIG LOSS CAN BE CONTROLLED BY SPRAY

Spraying will control insects and diseases which cause the yearly loss of more than 100,000,000 bushels of the potato crop. If spraying were not now practiced, the present enormous loss would be even greater, but sprays are not used as widely or as thoroughly as they should be.

Proper spraying controls the Colorado potato beetle and late blight—the worst enemies of the potato—blister beetles, flea beetles, cutworms and oth-

er caterpillars, leafhoppers, aphids or plant lice, early blight, and other foliage diseases. For most of the insects and for the diseases spraying with bordeaux mixture and arsenate of lead is recommended, but for leafhoppers and plant lice contact sprays, such as nicotine sulphate and emulsions, are the best. For blight bordeaux mixture is an effective means of control. Other methods calculated to help protect the crop are jarring and driving, crop rotation and clean cultural practices.

IDLER MUST WORK OR FIGHT

Every Loafer Put to Work Releases a Man Who May Help on Farm—Farmer Needs Help.

This is no time for word mauling or baby talk.

WAYWARD PORTLAND BOYS COME TO GRIEF IN HALSEY

Stolen Auto and Take Wild Ride—Caught by Deputy Sheriff Taylor.

Albert Rosenthal and Curtis Corcoran, 16 year old Portland boys, left their homes Monday night about 7:30 to "take an auto ride." On Tuesday their worried parents notified the police that the boys had not returned and a search was instituted.

The boys were picked up here Tuesday evening by Deputy Sheriff D. Taylor, who had been notified by the sheriff's office to keep a lookout for a stolen automobile. Deputy Taylor, accompanied by Balf Bond, took the boys and the machine to Albany that evening, and it is presumed that by this time the lads have been, so far as possible under the circumstances, restored to their distracted parents.

The car stolen at Portland was an Oakland Six. It was badly overheated. The boys ran out of oil, and had no money with which to buy more. They were cooling the engine by pouring water on it when the Halsey official arrested them. There was no license tag on the car.

The affair seems to have been the culmination of a crazy ambition to go into auto thievery on a big scale. After leaving Portland in the Oakland, which was curbed at the Y. M. C. A. building when they took it, the boys stole another car at Jefferson, which they abandoned soon af-

ter, and attempted to steal another from the grange hall at Conser, where a number of women were gathered for Red Cross work. They drove during the day to Brownsville, Sweet Home and Lebanon looking for stealable cars. It was a wild ride but soon ended.

It would be interesting to know what influences inspired the boys in the matter.

Red Cross Report

An auxiliary of the Linn County Red Cross was organized in Halsey May 12, 1917, with ten charter members. The auxiliary became a branch last May. The sewing room began making hospital garments one year ago, the first shipment being sent to Albany September 3. Following is a report of the work done by Halsey and Lake Creek and of the finances of the year:

166 pajama suits, 302 handkerchiefs, 223 napkins, 132 hospital shirts, 50 spint pillows, 24 pillow slips, 10 mufflers, 151 slings, 1 helmet, 50 pairs ward slippers, 18 pairs wristlets, 3 Belgian squares, 87 sweaters, 105 pairs wool socks, 117 pairs bed socks, 54 shoulder wraps, 33 wash cloths, 20 sponge cloths, 25,800 gun wipes, 1046 unhemmed squares.

To meet the expense of these articles the people of Halsey and Lake Creek have through one means and another contributed for local use \$1409.31. There is also due the branch from the June Red Cross drive \$277, which will be received in due time.

The July shipment of Red Cross work consisted of 1 wash cloth, 9 pairs knitted socks, 11 sweaters, 3 pairs ward slippers, 4 pairs bed socks, 34 pajama suits, 900 gun wipes.

1 cup corn meal	1 teaspoon salt
1 cup rye flour	1 cup milk
2 tablespoons sugar	1 egg
5 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder	2 tablespoons shortening

Barley flour or oat flour may be used instead of rye flour with equally good results. Sift dry ingredients into bowl; add milk, beaten egg and melted shortening. Stir well. Put into greased pan, allow to stand in warm place 20 to 25 minutes and bake in moderate oven 40 to 45 minutes.
