George Attig Dead

George Attig, an old and respected resident, died suddenly at his home five miles southwest of Halsey last Saturday, May 24. Mr. Attig was born in Wertenburg, Germany, May 22, 1839. He came to America in 1857. He lived in Livingston county, Illinois, thence moved to Nebraska, and nineteen years ago he came to Oregon. He was married to Anna Pifer April 29, 1870. To this union were born nine children. Two have gone beyond. Those who remain are Catharine Allen and Sarah Seacourt of Fairbury, Neb., John, Joseph, Nathan and Lillian of Halsey. The wife and mother also survives. Mr. Attig was a true christian, a member of the Halsey M. E. church.

Funeral services were conducted at the home by his pastor, J. D. Cain, assisted by the choir, Monday afternoon. The floral offerings by friends and neighbors were many. Mr. Attig was buried in the cemetery three miles southwest of Halsey.
