Obituary

Mrs. Louis Soderstrom, for a number of years a resident of Halsey and vicinity and who moved to Albany last fall, died at her home in that city Thursday night of last week, aged 54 years, after a long illness.

Johanna Soderstrom was born at Dalarne, Sweden. She came to the United States with her parents when she was three years of age, the family locating in Minnesota, where she grew to womanhood and was united in marriage to Mr. Soderstrom.

They came to Oregon about seven years ago.

Mrs. Soderstrom is survived by her husband, seven sons and two daughters.

Funeral services were held Sunday. Among those attending were several from the Halsey neighborhood, who went down to pay a last tribute to a good woman.

Ira Hunter, who was known to many Halsey people, died at the

home of his daughter, Mrs. R. M. Graves, at Eugene Sunday, June 8, at the age of 58 years. The deceased was born in Benton and near Corvallis all his life, except a few years in Waterville, Wash., where he was engaged in the mercantile business. He was at one time county clerk of Benton county.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. R. M. Graves of Eugene and Mrs. E. E. Wills of Portland; his father, Jos. C. Hunter of Brownsville; one sister, Mrs. Burl Callaway of Brownsville; and two brothers, John Hunter of Brownsville and Fred Hunter of Kingman, Arizona.

He was a member of the Masons and the Maccabees, the latter conducting the funeral services which were held at Corvallis Monday of last week. Burial was in Locke cemetery, Corvallis.
