A Pioneer Story.

The following article is taken from the Stayton Mail:

Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Wilbur made an auto trip to Halsey lately, returning with Mrs. Wilbur's mother, Mrs. W. H. Kirk.

Mrs. Kirk is one of the early pioneers of Oregon. She crossed the plains with her parents in 52. The trip was made by ox team, which was started the first day of April from Missouri, and the party landed in Oregon in October after seven long months.

Mrs. Kirk tells many interesting stories of the trip. Every night the cattle had to be herded during feeding time and every night the wagon train was formed in a circle and used as a corral to protect the cattle and people from the Indians. Although Mrs. Kirk says their party came thru with very few skirmishes with the red men.

The Kirks settled on what was called donation land 5 miles from Halsey, which Mr. Kirk acquired by trading an ox team and wagon for a half section to a settler.

This has been the home of the Kirks ever since. It is a long time to live in one place but Mrs. Kirk says she has a soft spot in her heart for "Good Old Oregon" and it is good enough for her.
