An Old Time Resident of Halsey Died in West Minister, B. C.

New West Minister, B C, Nov 6.—Victor Geo Cunningham, for thirty years a resident of this province and member of a pioneer family of this city, died at his residence, 901 St Andrews street, this morning, aged 79. The late Mr Cunningham, who had a wide circle of friends all over the West, conducted a successful blacksmith business in the royal city in the old days. A widower, his wife dying a couple of years ago, Mr Cunningham leaves to mourn his passing, his brother, James C Cunningham, one of West Minister's best known citizens, head of the hard ware firm of that name; four sons, James, of Eburne, Sam, of Vancouver, George, of San Francisco, and Major Tom Cunningham, of this city; also two daughters, Mrs R D Hendry and Mrs McLean, who resided with the late Mr Cunningham.

Mr Cunningham was born in Ireland. In 1852 he came out to Ontario, coming to British Columbia in 1889. He also spent part of his time in Oregon. He was well known in Masonic and Odd Fellow circles.

The funeral will take place under the Masonic auspices on Saturday at 2 o'clock from the residence, with a Masonic service at the Masonic Temple at 2:45, interment being at the Odd Fellows' cemetery.
