Shedd Produces a World Record Cow.

We have heard before of Linn County's fame as a dairy center, and of Linn ranking first among the counties of Oregon in having the greatest number of breeders of thoroughbred stock, and it is at this time that "The eyes of the World," are turned towards Oregon, and even towards the small town of Shedd, which is justly called "The Dairy Center." It is at this time that Shedd has won even more fame, by the world record cow, Lulu Alpha of Ashburn, which was produced by the result of years of hard study and competent work on the part of J M Dickson and son of Shedd.

When Lulu Alpha was a small calf, J J Van Kleek visited the Dickson Dairy farm with the idea of purchasing a few heifers to build up his herd, and three calves were purchased, one of which was Lulu Alpha, who has most assuredly made good, by starting on test at the age of one year and 324 days and has now finished with a most remarkable world record of 800.08 pounds of butter fat in 365 days, which far surpasses the holder of the highest record of 644.2 pounds of butter fat.

The record of Lulu Alpha shows what can be done by the proper care, together with the kinds of food given while on test, and it is in this achievement that we may praise J J Van Kleek and son of Beaverton Wayne Van Kleek is a very apt pupil, who fed and cared for Lulu Alpha almost entirely during the test, and for a period of nearly nine months, he untiringly milked her regularly four times a day.

This world record is not accidental but was brought about by an unusual combination of great families and individuals, the credit of which rightly goes to the breeding establishment of J M Dickson and son of Shedd, Oregon.

The dam of Lulu of Ashburn, Lucy of Humboldt, was an old cow brought by C C Dickson when he moved from California and located in Oregon, and is the only cow that he has retained from the Trigg herd in Cali.
