He fought their battles for them all that time and never lost a single battle, he gave them laws that have bound them to gether for thirty stormy centuries, it would be interesting, I say, if we could hear Moses' opinion of this colonel of cavalry, who in the only engagement in which he ever took a part he was driven into a hog yard and gave his sword to a sixteen year old boy, and after being exchanged for a mule and saddle, he valiantly surrendered his commission in the face of the enemy and returned to his home and devoted his time to pleading to Star route swindlers and lecturing on the "Mistakes of Moses."

I was in the city of Peoria, Illinois some years ago and I saw a fine, large, public building, and concluded I would look it over. I saw the offices, auditorium, swimming pool, reading rooms, parlors, reception rooms, and everything connected with what was no doubt the finest building in the city of Peoria, if not the finest in the state of Illinois.

I learned that the spot of ground on which it was built was at one time the home of Colonel Robert G Ingersoll, but that the building I was admiring so much was owned and controlled by the Young Men's Christian Association, a monument to show that God overrules all that his enemies may say or do, and makes their acts and words redound to His honor and glory.
