The Trip to Albany.

On Friday, March 26, the physics class, accompanied by their instructor, Miss Erwin, visited the Mountain States Power plant at Albany.

Passes were obtained and the class was escorted through the plant by the manager, who explained the various things as we viewed them.

Water power is used by the plant. It is taken from the Albany ditch, from there going to the large turbines, furnishing power for the operation of the plant. The water power thus employed runs large engines, and these in turn run the dynamos by means of belts. The theory of the dynamo was explained, and the various instruments shown, that register the electricity generated and its power.

If, at any time something happens that prevents water power being used, the plant reverts to steam, furnished by large boilers and furnaces.

In connection with the plant is a shop with all necessary appliances and tools operated by electricity.

The water supply was next examined. Here, the water is pumped through a succession of pumps to the reservoir or filter on the top of the building. In this reservoir the water goes through the incipient stages of filtration. Through openings in the reservoirs the water runs into other tanks. At these openings sand can be seen percolating through the water as it runs out.

The method by which the water is purified is the same as that used by the United States in purifying the water used by the army. It consists of an extremely diluted solution of chlorine. A special apparatus is used filled with chlorine that mechanically purifies the water.

The instruments for controlling the water in the different pipes and tanks were shown. They are operated very simply by the use of electricity. Other tanks were seen in which the water goes through in the process of filtering. When the water is completely filtered it is very clear. Looking down a pipe through a tank of purified water with a light at the bottom, it seems that water is only four or five feet in depth but in reality is more than twice that depth.

Our course of instruction was terminated by viewing the transformer room. Owing to the great voltage we could not enter but only look through the door.

The transformers are of the step down type, handling a current of 33,000 volts, and reducing this to a few thousand volts. The current is now ready for the wires, where it is again transformed for the use of the patrons. In the room there is an appliance for controlling the electric shocks due to lightning.

The electricity is conducted off into the ground. Thereby making the plant safe from lightning.

Much practical knowledge was derived from visiting the plant, and all making the trip report a good time for the afternoon.
