



But even before the war, when money would buy twice as much as it buys now, the average cost at all other state institutions was \$325 a year. In addition

At the State University it is at present \$322 per student: at the was about 25 over the preceding College, \$300. But in state institutions elsewhere, statistics show the average to be \$995. These are convincing proofs of economical administration, but the three institutions can no longer give satisfactory training to the vast numbers of Oregon boys and girls (5400 in full time courses alone), unless they receive more support.
