Track Meet At Albany.

The Linn county interscholastic track meet was held at Albany, Saturday, May 8th. Team representing Albany, Lebanon, Harrisburg, Brownsville, and Halsey participating in the meet.

Lebanon won the meet. Stearns of Lebanon, was the scintillating star of the day, winning the admiration of the spectators by his speedy and beautiful running.

Halsey High School was represented by only one student, Roy Farmer. Although handicapped by insufficient training, he made a very excellent showing. Farmer placed second in the pole vault and high jump, being nosed out by a small fraction.

Much interest was centered on Farmer for his athletic ability. Coach McNeal of Albany College, commented upon his work, and members and coach of the Lebanon team urged him to attend there next year. More than one remark was heard to the effect, "That Farmer sure is some athlete."

Consolidation Meeting.

Last night at the city hall a large gathering of people young and old met to witness the weaving of a May pole, to listen to some fine music by the High School orchestra, and to listen to a talk by State School Superintendent Churchill on the advantages of consolidating two or more school districts into one.

Mr Churchill is a forceful although not an eloquent speaker and he presented the advantages of consolidated schools from many view points.

He said the "Little Red rural school house" had served its day but at the present time it is weighed in the balance and is found wanting. That better results are to be obtained by hauling the children from five or six miles out in the country to a centrally located graded school, and that the ordinary students would graduate from the eighth grade in a graded school one year earlier than if he attended an ungraded school.

He also spoke for a few minutes on the millage question. The subject of consolidation

will probably be a much debated one for some time, and it is the Enterprise's prediction that it will be adopted in the near future.

Clean up Day.

The common Council of the city of Halsey met in regular session on Monday May 10, designated and set aside Wednesday May 19, 1920, as general clean up day for the city of Halsey, and all residents having tin cans or other rubbish which they wish to dispose of are hereby requested to have them in sacks, boxes or barrels and ready for the drayman who will call for it. Those residing on the west side of the R R track should have their refuse on either 2nd, 4th or 5th Street, while those residing on the east side of the track should have their refuse on East 2nd or East 3rd Streets. This move is taken to consolidate the refuse as much as possible and expedite the work of the drayman and it is the hope of the council that they will have the cooperation of all the residents of the city in making a general clean up and thus improving the looks of the town. Cut and burn your brush and briars, get rid of tin cans and all other rubbish and make a clean city of Halsey.
