

Obituary

May Rector was born in Halsey, September 26, 1887, and died at Portland, May 16, 1924, at the age of 32 years, 7 months and 21 days.

She was a continuous resident of Halsey until about nine years ago. It was here she received her education, became a member of the Methodist church, and grew to womanhood. For the past nine years she has resided in different places; while at Harrisburg, which was her home for about six years, she met and married Howard Reeves. This union were born three children, Willis James, Charles Hurley, and Harry Dale.

Besides the husband and three children she leaves one sister Mrs Hurley Wallace of Portland and her father and mother, M and Mrs Jas Rector of Halsey, a few other relatives and many friends.

The sad end came after a brief illness at the Emanuel hospital in Portland, altho she had been in poor health since having the flu last winter.
