Limitation of FGUR PER CENT STATE INDEBTEDNESS
FOR PERMAI LAT ROADS.—Purpose: To amend Section 7 of
Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon so as to permit the
creation of debts. I habilities including previous debts and liabilities
for the purpose of cuiding and maintaining permanent roads to the
amount of four p. cont of the assessed valuation of all the property
in the State of Oregon, instead of two per centas now provided by law.

#### NO PROPERTY TAX-NO DIRECT TAX NO INCREASE IN APTO LICENSE FEES NO INCREASE OF GASOLINE TAX

Keep these three facts in mind. The present auto license fees and gasoline tax will pay both the principal and interest on all the bonds under this amendment, and will yield an annual surplus besides for other state highway work. No additional taxation of any kind.

#### FEDERAL FUNDS MUST BE MATCHED

Oregon must have sufficient Highway Funds to match Federal apportionments or Oregon cannot get the benefit of Federal money for Oregon Roads. Increasing this constitutional limit is a necessity. Unless limit is increased, either state roads cannot be completed for many, many years, or must be finished by direct property taxation. This measure averts direct property tax for state highways and makes early completion possible. Let's get the roads built now,

#### Income from Present Sources Sufficient to Pay Principal and Interest.

The fact that revenues from auto license feer and gaseline tax, without increase of present rates, will be ample to pay both principal and interest in these bonds, is elegily set forth by official figures in the State Pamphlet, mailed to every registered voter.
