Stranger Than Fiction.

A strange story comes from Minnesota. The mummified body of a man, not at all decayed, but dried and shriveled by the lapse of time into something rivaling the best Egyptian art was recently found.

In clearing a piece of land the workmen cut down a gigantic hollow white oak tree, which in a large opening concealed a petrified body. The owner of the farm recognized at once in the mummy the body of Jean La Rue, a former farm hand, who had mysteriously disappeared on August 30, 1862, which was during the Sioux uprising when a boat load of soldiers were on their way up the Minnesota river.

When Jean La Rue heard the firing he seemed to nearly lose his reason from fear, rushed into the house and seized his rifle and some other belongings, including about \$700 in money, and fled to the woods. He must have known of this hollow tree and thought to hide there, slipped down too far and, being unable to extricate himself, must have perished there where his body, preserved in the living oak, failed to decay.

His rifle was found and the money, \$783.50, was in his pocket. Also there was found a diary, and in it, undated, but on the page following the one dated Friday, August 29, 1862, was written the following: "Cannot get out, surely must die. If ever found, send me and my money to my mother, Madame Suzanne L La Rue, near Tarascon, in the province of Bouchas, Du Phone, France."
