Pay Your Government Taxes.

June is a busy month for the Internal Revenue Bureau, as during that month all special taxes for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 1921, are due and payable.

Collector of Internal Revenue, Milton A Miller, has mailed out to all special taxpayers forms upon which return for payment of tax must be made. These special taxpayers include proprietors of theatres, for hire automobiles, pleasure boats, pool and oilliard tables, bowling alleys, shooting galleries, retail dealers n oleomargarine, brokers, pawn prokers, etc.

Other classes of taxpayers affected are druggists, physicians, dentists, and other practitioners, who must complete their re- registration under the Harrison act not later than July 1st, after which date they will be delin-

On or before June 15th the second installment of income tax will be due and payable, and nopay one instailment when due makes due and payable all the remaining installments which would ordinarily be due on September 15th and December 15th.

Collector Miller would greatly appreciate the co-operation of taxpayers in making their returns and payments as early in June as possible.

BREAKFAST is too often eaten as a duty rather than a joy. The success of the day may depend upon the spirit of breakfast. Muffins

2 cups flour 3 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder 1 tablespoon sugar 4 teaspoon salt 1 cup milk

2 eggs 1 tablespoon shortening Sift together flour, baking powder, sugar and salt; add milk, well-beaten eggs and melted shortening; mix well. Grease muffin tins and put two tablespoons of batter interest. to each. Bake in hot oven 20 to 25 minutes.

Corn Muffins

% cup corn meal
14 cups flour
4 teaspoons Royal Baking
Powder
4 teaspoon sait
2 tablespoons sugar
1 cup milk
2 tablespoons shortening
1 egg

Sift together corn meal, flour, baking powder, salt and sugar; add milk, melted shortening and well-beaten egg; mix well. Grease muffin tins and drop two tablespoons of mixture into each. Bake about 35 minutes in hot oven.

Popovers

2 cups flour 4 teaspoon salt 2 eggs 2 cups milk

Sift together flour and salt. Make a well in flour, break eggs into well, add milk and stir until smooth. Pour into hot greased gem pans and bake 25 to 35 minutes in a very hot oven. If taken out of oven too soon they will fall.
