Glenn Chance Is Granted a Divorce.

Finding that the defendant had run away with another man, as charged by her husband in his complaint, Judge Percy R Kelly, yesterday afternoon in circuit court, granted a decree of divorce to Glenn Chance, of Halsey, from Blanche Chance.

In his order granting the decree Chance is given the custody of his 2 year old son, Harry Lewis Chance, and the child's mother is enjoined from intermeddling or disputing the authority of the father over him.

In the complaint the plaintiff charged that his wife left him on June 20th last to go to Lincoln county to reside with A V Holgate. Letters written by Holgate to Mrs Chance and the note written by the defendant notifying her husband she had gone away were introduced as evidence.

The couple were married at Albany in September, 1915, and had lived in Halsey during their married life.—Sat Herald.
