Our Sermonette

Cleanse thou me from secret faults. Keep back thy servant from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me. Let the words of my mouth, and the meditations of my heart, be

acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer. Ps 19: 12-14.

It would appear that every intelligent Christian would continually pray this inspired prayer for cleansing from secret faults, that he might thus be restrained from presumptuous sins; and thus praying heartily, he would also watch against these beginnings of sin and keep his heart in a cleansed and pure condition, by going continually to the fountain of grace for help in every time of need. He who seeks to live a life of holiness and nearness to the Lord by merely guarding against outward or presumptuous sins, and who neglects the beginnings of sin in the secrets of his own mind, is attempting a right thing in a very foolish and unreasonable way.

Would Wipe Oregon Off the Map.

What would happen to Oregon if the constitutional amendment to limit legal rate of interest in this state to 4 and 5 per cent should pass?

The answer is simple. From an industrial standpoint the state would be wiped off the map. Even the United States government cannot borrow money at 5 per cent today. Then what chance would the individual borrower have of getting money at any such rates in Oregon.

The passage of such a bill would be industrial suicide for Oregon.

A meeting of the Linn county business men has been called for 7:30 p m Tuesday, August 17th at the rooms of the Commercial Club at Albany for the purpose of discussing the proposed measure to be voted on at the November election concerning the 5 per cent interest rate bill. Every business man in the county who can spare the time should attend this meeting. While the Enterprise would be pleased to be able to borrow what money it needs at 5 per cent, yet it knows that no bank nor individual is going to loan it money at 5 per cent when it can get 8 and 10 per cent elsewhere. And then when it is willing to pay the 8 or 10 or even 12 per cent if necessary, it would be very discouraging to hear the banker say, "I am very sorry but it is against the law for me to loan it to you, so I will have to pass it up." Vancouver, Washington, would be the closest place we could possibly get money, and nothing sure about it then. We wouldn't swear about it of course, because that would be wrong, but we might be tempted to say "By Snort."
