He died at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, August 26, 1920. The funeral services were conducted from the Christian church jointly by Rev Clemo and Elder Philips.

The church was filled to its seating capacity and a large concourse of people followed the remains to the Pine Grove cemetery where nearly as many more were waiting for the funeral cortege to arrive.
