### First Fossil Skeleton Mounted.

The genus megatherium, the largest of the ground sloth family, was the first fossil skeleton ever to be mounted. Nearly two centuries ago a Spanish colonist in the vice royalty of Buenos Aires, now the Argentine Republic, discovered the huge skeleton of an animal on the river Leyan, a few miles from the city. The skeleton was sent to Madrid and later mounted and is still seen in the Royal museum. Since then numerous skeletons of these animals have been found in both North and South America. The megatherium was 25 feet long from tip to tip. He was a fearsome animal to look at, but is believed to have been harmless and to have been domesticated. It is estimated that the first Americans milked these mammals, and that one milking netted as much as that given by ten good Jersey cows.—Scientific American.
