The National Civil Liberties Bureau issued a statement Jan 22, 1920, that at Alcatraz Island, San Francisco, Col R D Johnson, the commanding officer, has introduced four dark cages six feet high, twenty-three inches in length, and one foot broad, in one of which, Robert Simmons, serving a ten-year sentence as a conscientious objector, was confined at the time the statement was made. In this iron strait jacket, like the Chinese torture box, the poor prisoner is unable to sit down, lie down, or fully stand.

What is our government coming to anyhow that a man can be tortured for exercising the brains that God has given him?

Men have been sent to the penitentiary for 80 years for publishing a religious conviction founded on the words of the Bible. And this takes place in the best government on the face of the globe.

One man was crucified once on a charge of sedition, who, even when the mob was arresting him, reproved one of his followers for drawing a sword in his defense.

But the doctrines of Christ still govern the minds of (some) men, while Pilate (who crucified him) would scarcely have been heard of in this day had he not given the command to put the Son of God to death. And Rome at that time mistress of the world, is a forgotten nation.

And so will any other nation eventually be that continually goes contrary to the teachings of the Man of Galilee.
