Frank Clingman Killed by a Tractor.

Frank Clingman, 52 years old, a farmer living near Peoria, and well known here in Halsey, was killed last Friday night about 7 o'clock, when a tractor which he was operating turned over, pinning him underneath.

Mr Clingman had been working in the field all the afternoon and when he did not return to the house at the usual time, his mother and sister, who lived with him, went out to see what detained him. They found the tractor overturned and Mr Clingman's body under it, with the gasoline tank on his chest.

Mr Clingman was unmarried and had lived his entire life in the Peoria neighborhood. Besides his mother and sister, who lived with him on the farm, a brother who resides in Washington, survives him.

Funeral services were held at the Pine Grove church Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock by Rev Reed, pastor of the U P church of Shedd.
