

This amount has been determined after careful survey and investigation of the actual needs. It will require approximately \$20,000.00 for repairs, fuel, oil, and other equipment for operating the trucks. rock crushers, tractors, rollers and graders.

Linn county must have two additional road rollers; at present Linn county has but one roller with over 2400 miles of road to take care of. Whereas Benton county has three rollers with 500 miles of road to take care of, and Lane county has four rollers with 1500 miles of road, and Marion county has ten rollers with 1600 miles of road. A great deal can be gained in road construction by packing and thoroughly rolling the graded and graveled highways.

Lane county has a tax of approximately 8 mills for road purposes alone; Benton county has a tax of approximately 7 mills for road purposes alone; and Linn county has a tax for road purposes alone of approximately three mills and a half.

The county court is putting before the taxpayers of the county at the coming election the proposition of increasing the taxes three mills for this coming year, which would net the county approximately \$90,000 00 additional money. This increase is for the coming (one year) only.
