Latest Election News in a Nutshell.

Harding is elected president with at least 346 votes in the electoral college. Cox seems to be sure of 127 votes while there are still 58 in doubt. As it only takes 266 to elect, Harding will have a margin of 80, even if all the doubtful states go to Cox.

The next congress will be republican. The senate will probably have a majority of 10 and the house will probably have a majority of close to 100.

R N Stanfield is elected over Senator Chamberlain by something near 3000.

It is probable that the entire county ticket is republican. The closest race was for county superintendent of schools, but Mrs Cummings is in the lead with what returns are in.

The two losing candidates were A Wesley 61, and George Hayes 55 votes.

Monster Eggs.

An egg, equivalent in size to 150 hens' eggs, and in volume to two gallons, is on view in the museums. The egg was laid centuries ago by a now extinct fowl, the aepyornis, and is designated as a fossil by archeologists. The aepyornis, according to the results of expert research, was a huge wingless creature, the largest and most formidable bird of prey that ever trod the earth. In life it has been variously estimated to have stood from seven to twelve feet in height, possessing massive and powerful limbs. This great bird surpassed the ostrich, the king of modern birds, both in size, herculean strength and build. It formerly lived in considerable numbers on the island of Madagascar.

Growing Sugar Cane.

Sugar cane requires an abundance of sunshine and water and a deep, fertile soil. In planting, the stalks are laid lengthwise in furrows, and each joint sends up a shoot, which later produces suckers. When ready for harvesting, a field of sugar cane resembles a corn field, but the plants are somewhat larger and there are no tassels and no ears. The stalks at this time have grown about 12 months and have changed from green to reddish in color, while most of the lower leaves have fallen away. They are cut by hand with a long knife, stripped of their leaves and carried on carts or small cars to the sugar mill.

SOME FACTS ABOUT THE PHILIPPINES

The University of Santo Tomas is 25 years older than Harvard.

The Filipino people number 10,350,640, of which 9,495,272 are Christians and only 9 per cent non-Christians.

They have been Christians for 300 years and have a culture and refinement that will compare very favorably with that of other nations.

There are only 3,054 Japanese in the Philippines. There are about 100,000 Japanese in California alone, or 15 times as many as in the entire Philippine archipelago.

English is taught exclusively in the Philippine public schools. Two million natives now speak English fluently, and there are 700,000 English speaking children in the public schools. It is destined to be the national language.

Seventy per cent of the inhabitants of the Philippines over ten years of age, according to a census just completed, are literate. This is a higher percentage of literacy than that of any South American country, higher than that of Spain and higher than that of any of the new republics of Europe whose independence is being guaranteed by the Allies.

The Filipino people are unanimous in their desire for independence. Whenever they are called upon to deposit their ballots they have always ratified this aspiration. At every session before adjournment their representatives in the Legislature reiterate their faith in the principles of liberty and the independence of the Filipino people.

The Filipinos declare they have no grudge or grievance against the American people. Their appeal is accompanied by a message of friendship and gratitude for all that America has done for them. They point out that Uncle Sam gave independence to Cuba, and they hope that they, too, will receive that boon without which, they declare, no civilized and patriotic people can enjoy the maximum of happiness and self-respect.

A special delegation of Filipinos, officially representing the Filipino people, attended the Republican and Democratic National conventions, seeking an indorsement of the Filipino desire for independence in the two platforms. Their arguments, briefly stated, were as follows:

First.—That the American Declaration of Independence declares that governments derive their just powers from the consent of the governed;

Second.—That the American Congress, in the Jones law, solemnly promised the Filipinos independence upon the establishment of a stable government, and that their claim that the said stable government is now in existence in the islands has been officially confirmed by America's own representatives there; and

Third.—That America went before the world in the recent war as the avowed champion of "self determination," American soldiers having been told it was one of the things they were fighting and dying for.
