ALSO ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM EVERYWHERE

Koontz Store Robbed.

When C H Koontz went to the store last Monday morning, he found that some party or parties unknown had broken into the store and taken a number of silk waists, some dress goods, some ladies' purses and some silverware. The thief entered the store at the window on the north side and left the same way, as footsteps on the desk would testify.

So far as known at present everything that was taken was something in demand by ladies. Estimated loss \$300.

Final Notes on the Election.

Last week we placed a conservative estimate on the election as based on returns up to the time we went to press, and we stated that Harding was assured of 346 electoral votes and that Stanfield had a majority of more than 3000 votes over Chamberlain.

Later returns show that Harding will get more than 400 electoral votes and that two of the states that have heretofore helped to make up the solid south have broken ranks and are in the republican columns, namely, Oklahoma and Tennessee.

Stanfield's majority over Chamberlain is more than 16000; all three members of the U S house of representatives are republicans; every state elective office and every Linn county elective office has been filled by republicans.

It was not a landslide it was an avalauche.

The national house of representatives will have a republican plurality of 176. The largest ever. The senate will have a majority of 10.

In the state legislature there are thirty senators; one of them, a holdover, is a democrat.

In the state house of representatives there are sixty-one members; two of them, holdovers, are democrats.

State Fair Prizes.

In looking over the list of prizes that were won at the state fair, we noticed some prizes that were awarded to Halsey people that have not been mentioned in the Enterprise. Some of the following prizes have and some have not been reported. F H Porter cleaned up nearly everything in the Red Polled line, taking all but one premium which was 2nd on a bull 3-years old, which went to C Sargent of Scio.

C R Evans won ten premiums in the Holstein class as follows: 1st in produce of cow; breeders young herd, Junior heifer calf, 2nd and 3d on Senior bull calf, 3d on bull 3 years or over, senior yearling heifer, and get of sire, and 5th on Senior heifer calf.

C L Falk jr won Percheron premiums as follows: one 1st, one 2d, one 4th and one 5th.

R A Templeton won both champions, eleven 1sts, and four 2nds in the Cheviot class.

Claude McKern and Miss Jane Caine of Corvallis, were married last Thursday afternoon at the Methodist parsonage in Albany by Rev J C Spencer. Only a few of the relatives were present. They expect to make their home in Hal-

sey. The Enterprise extends congratulations.

Halsey Ratifies in Grand Shape.

While we chronicled a ratification here on Wednesday evening of last week, we were not aware that the stupendous republican victory called for a double barreled ratificate, but such seemed to be the case, for on Thursday night a parade was formed in which Clate Smith's small mule and Fred Robinson's large gray horse were hitched side by side to represent that the republican majority and democratic minority were expected to pull together in the U S congress. With this ill assorted team pulling its load in the van, and the Halsey band (or maybe it was the bandee) discoursing peals of bittersweet the parade marched thru the main streets of our city and finally repaired to the ball ground where bursts of oratory emanated from the speakers of the evening, prominent among whom were Mayor Walton and Alderman-elect White.

Nor was it a one-sided affair. The gunner of the evening was Jas McWilliams, one of our staunchest democrats, who fired the salutes with a zeal that would outzeal many of the republicans.

After the patriotic speeches had been made, the assembly, consisting mainly of men and women and boys and girls, proceeded to play their ratifying games such as miller boy, skiptomaloo, and others too numerous to mention, after which they all repaired to their homes, thankful that presidential elections only come once in four years.
