This worthy pioneer and his aged mother have both gone to that bourne from whence no traveler was ever known to return. But the four-year old son is now in the sear and yellow leaf.

This son of George B Gray was when a young man, married fifty years ago to Miss Mary A Morgan of Linn county. Nov 3, 1870. She was a daughter of Mr and Mrs Thomas Morgan, early pioneers.

This being their golden wedding they celebrated the same by spreading a bounteous feast to which they invited relatives and friends to partake to the number of thirty-four.

Their home was beautifully decorated for the occasion. Mr Gray is 71 and his wife is 72. They have two children, Mrs E

E Gormley of Halsey, and Mrs J W McClelland of San Francisco, California.

They have five grandchildren and three great grandchildren.
