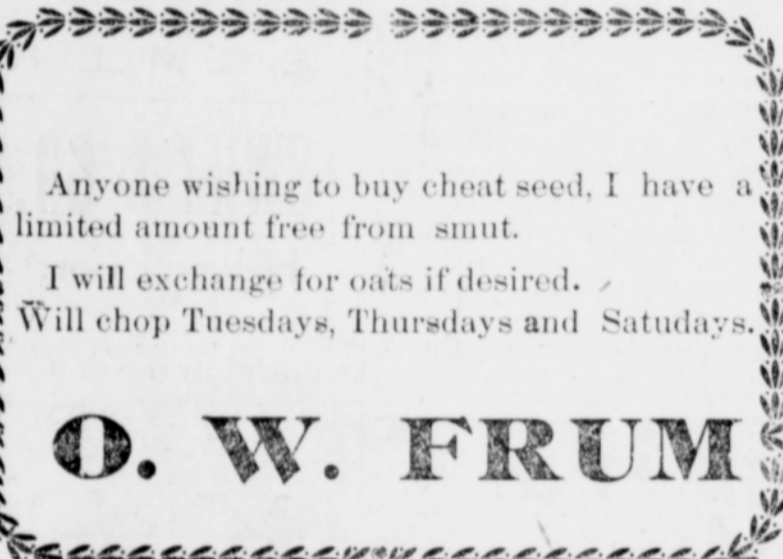

And now why tarriest thou? Arise and be baptized. Acts 22: 16.

There is a directness in this address that is worthy of being copied by all who have an influence upon others, and who are seeking them along to the right way. Urge them to promptness, to a full confession of the Lord and the Truth. If they are not inclined promptly to obey after their eyes of faith have seen the Lord, and after their ears have heard his voice, they will be much less likely after a while, when the world and the flesh and the devil will say to them, do not be an extremist; be moderate; do not make a full consecration of yourself to the Lord. Your neighbors and friends will think you beside yourself, and it will interfere with your hopes, and prospects, and turn your friends into enemies. It will cost you too much: Go slowly.

Grange Backs American Plan.

The National Grange adopted a resolution at its recent convention in Boston declaring for the open shop and in favor of collective bargaining.

"We disapprove of any system," the resolution said, "which denies to any individual the right to work in any place where there is need of his industry at any time and at any wage which is satisfactory to him, or quit his employment wherever and for whatever reason may be to him controlling, subject only to such contract obligations as he may willingly enter into and as may be imposed in an American court of justice."

The grange is against labor radicalism which would throttle industry and limit production by enforcement of closed shop rules which deny employment to large numbers of competent workmen.

It is estimated that one-sixth of the food supply of the nation is derived from milk and its products. The advance work in the department includes dairy stock judging, principles of sanitation, breeding, herd management, and dairy manufacturing courses covering the various phases of manufacturing of dairy products.

Bake in well-greased hot waffle iron until brown. Serve hot with maple syrup. It should take about 1 1/2 minutes to bake each waffle.
