A word in season, how good s: a word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver. 'rov 15: 23, 25: 11.

We are to remember, when talkng with those who have an ear to ear and are inquiring the way of he Lord, that there are great rises in the lives of men, momentons occasions, in which one word may be more valuable, more potent, than would be a hundred words or a thousand, words at nother time under different cirumstances; and we are to be instant in the Lord's service, whether seasonable, or unseasonable to ourselves, -- gladly ready to lay down our lives for the brethron. We are to distinguish, however, between out-of-season to ourselves, if it be in season and opportune for them. Dec 2. Dear Mother: I guess I am a good sailor for I have not been a bit sick nor have I missed a single meal.

We left San Francisco yester- 1 pound plain mixed day noon, and at 3 o'clock we hit 3 pound lots per pound a storm all right, and the boat 5 pound lots per pound sure did roll, but tonight it is Broken mixed per pound not so bad, and by tomorrow they 3 pound lots per pound tell me we will be in the warm 5 pound lots per pound zone. 1 am enjoying every min- Peanut Brittle per pound ute of the trip and I guess if I could 3 pound lots per pound keep well in the storm we had, I 5 pound lots per pound will be able to stand it the rest of No 1 soft shelled walnuts the time.


They had a movie on the ship No 2 soft shell walnuts tonight in the social hall and it 3 pounds soft shell walnuts was pretty good.

Dec 3. All day there has been 2 lbs fresh roasted peanuts a hard wind and the spray came |1 pound salted peanuts over the ship so that it was cold 2 pounds salted peanuts and damp outside, and tonight 1 pound soft shell almonds just at supper time the boat began 3 pounds soft shell almonds rolling so that it threw every thing 3 pounds mixed nuts off the table or nearly so, and 1 pound filberts some of the people off their seats, 2 pounds filberts I was at a little table that was Eastern popcorn intended for two of us so that I Hip-o-Lite could hang on, but the old boat 2 Del Monte peas sure did rell and toss first on one 2 Del Monte corn side and then on the other. I am 2 Del Monte tomatoes o a bit seasick, so 1 am happyor am I afraid? Some are scared
