Less Taxes and More Economy.

The federal government has enacted into law the principle that Mrs Lloyd Byerly. investors in railroad securities are entitled to a fair return on their investment over and above the cost of operation including corporate government determines what the railroads shall charge for rendering transportation service to the people.

Many of us used to think and apparently a few state executives still think that by increasing publie utility taxes, extravagance and wasteful practices in public office may prevail without cost to the people, overlooking the fact that every dollar paid by corporations for taxes must come out of the pockets of the people.

In other words, if railroad and public utility taxes be increased the burden is shifted back on the people by an increase in freight or passenger rates or charges for

It is passing strange that at a time when taxation is a burden on everyone, at a time when public expenses should be cut to the quick and extravagance wiped out, some of those in public office charged with the duty of administration, instead of looking for opportunities to economize, are advocating both increased taxation of property already overtaxed and the raising of additional revenue from LOY sources.

It is time for courageous thought and action. The people are groanill-prepared to stand additional burdens. Incompetence and extravagance in public office must be eliminated. Not a dollar should be taken from taxpayers above that required to maintain the goverament of the municipality, county, state and nation honestly and economically administered.

Those invest d with public aubority from governor to road supervisor should be made to realize that this is no time for increased burdens, but rather that they will be held to strict account for failure to avail of every opportunity to increase efficiency and reduce the cost of government.

The demand of the hour is not increased taxation but retrenchment in public expenditures.
