Coquille Dairymen Stand by Oregon Co-operative League.

At a meeting of over 100 dairymen, all members of the Oregon Dairymen's Co-operative League, at Coquille lately, the following resolution was passed with only 6 dissenting votes:

Whereas, there are many false rumors being circulated by those who are not in sympathy with farmers co-operative marketing associations in the state of Ore. and which are apparently designed to injure the confidence of individual members in the management of our dairy marketing organization.

Whereas we recognize that the country is going through a general period of after war adjustment which has meant to the dairy industry as it has to many basic productive phases of agriculture a deflation on the market value of product of 100 per cent or more in a period of 12 or 14 months time, and whereas we believe that without the concentrated co-operative action of farmers through co-operative marketing associations as the Oregon Dairymen's Co-operative League, the Fruit Growers' Association, the Pacific Co-operative Poultry Association, etc, which organizations are operated to save thru more economic methods of distribution a larger percentage of the consumers dollar for the original producer, the farmer will be further forced to stand a much greater deflation in his product which will mean ruin to many of our long term tenants and farmers who are making contract payments on farms.

Therefore be it resolved by this mass meeting of dairymen members of the Oregon Dairymen's Co-operative League assembled in Coquille this 30th day of March, 1921, without influence or prejudice do hereby wish to have made generally publicly known among the farmers in other parts of the state and other states of the union that we firmly believe our co-operative marketing organization to be founded on the right co-operative bargaining principle, and we reaffirm the endorsement of this principle of co-operative marketing.

While there may be some mistakes which we and the management of our organization have made during the period of its first year in organization we do not believe them to be more than to be expected through the initiation of so large an organization in so short a time when the world's finance has been in such a chaotic condition.

We furthermore realize that in co-operative organization of this type more or less of confidence must be placed in our board of directors, and the management through its paid officers, of our affairs and we wish to express this confidence in our present board of twenty-five members.
