## HALSEY NEWS NOTES

ALSO ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM EVERYWHERE

### The Road Question Again.

It was thought some time ago that the route of the Pacific Highway was definitely settled to go through Halsey on Second street, but it seems that some of the citizens were not satisfied with that and the question has come up again.

The Commissioners met in Portland last Friday and three of our prominent citizens, L E Walton, M E Gardner, and E B Penland went down to interview them.

It seems that there are complications that no one here knew about that have arisen that may put a different aspect entirely on the question.

The state is to pay 50 per cent of the cost of the highway, the county will pay 25 per cent, and the other 25 per cent will have to be paid by the property owners whose property abuts the highway, while all the side crossings will have to be made at the expense of the city irrespective of whether their property adjoins the highway or not.

Now if the highway goes through on Second street all those crossings will have to be paid for by the city at large, while the people owning property that abuts on that street will have to pay one fourth of the cost as far as their property goes or if they only have property on one side of the road they would have to pay one eighth of the assessment.

If it goes on First street, there will be fewer street crossings to pay for as the property on the east side of the street, a good part of it at any rate, belongs to the railroad and there are only three or four crossings to be bothered with. On the other hand, if it comes on First street, there will be quite a strip off Mr Naef's property that will have to be paid for.

The Commissioners have taken the matter under advisement and at present writing no one knows whether it will go on First or Second street.
