 The Linn county fair is to be four days this year. The four days will be Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of the first week in October. This was decided Saturday at a meeting of the board of directors of the fair association.

The first three days will be featured by big races and the last day will be school day with all the school activities as the big feature. School children will be admitted free on that day.

At the meeting Saturday the officers of the fair association for the past year were re-elected. It was announced at the meeting that the board had signed a contract with the Frisco Exposition Carnival company, the largest carnival company on the road. The company will be here with two trains of exhibits and will give the fair association 15 per cent of the money taken in by the many shows.
