Good Prospects for the Halsey-Irish Bend Market Road.

The market road between Halsey and Irish Bend ferry is almost assured, according to reports taken to Albany by County Agent A C Heyman, who visited at Lake Creek recently in the interest of the Linn County Farm Bureau.

At a meeting held some time ago it was decided that Lake Community raise \$1000 to match a like amount raised by the Halsey people. It is said that the \$2,000 has practically been subscribed, thus making the probability of the proposed market road almost a certainty. The proposed road will be seven miles long from the Irish Bend ferry on the Willamette river to Halsey. The county is also co-operating in the movement.
