Obituary

SUSAN ZIEGLER

Susan Carter was born near Rock Island Ill, March 27, 1844, and was married to Ben Ziegler in that state, and shortly afterwards moved to Missouri, and from Missouri they came to Oregon and located in Peoria where they lived for about ten years and then they moved to Halsey. Mr Ziegler died here about 27 years ago.

Mrs Ziegler has lived here since that time but of late years her memory has been very defective, and since the death of her nephew, Clyde Carter, she has seemed to grow worse and worse.

She died at the home of her nephew, Wm Carter, Saturday morning at 12:30, May 28, 1921. Funeral services were conducted Monday from the Christian church by Rev Smith, after which the remains were taken to the Pine Grove cemetery for interment.

A brother, W G Carter, a niece, Mrs Rosa Davis, and a nephew, W F Carter, survive her.
