Fruit Report

Up to June 1, fruit prospects of Western Oregon are as follows, according to advices received by the Oregon Growers Cooperative Association.

Apples—Rogue River valley, big crop. Umpqua valley, heaviest crop ever shipped. Willamette valley, big crop with sizes and quality better than a year ago.

Cherries—Willamette valley, 60 to 70 per cent crop. Umpqua valley, 50 per cent crop.

Pears—Medford district, about three fourths of last year. Ump-

qua and Willamette valleys, about the same as last year.

Prunes—Willamette valley, river bottom orchards promise fair crop. Others will have light crop. Conditions spotted. Umpqua valley, Italians will average with crop of past ten years. Petites, not setting very heavy, but promise of large sizes.
