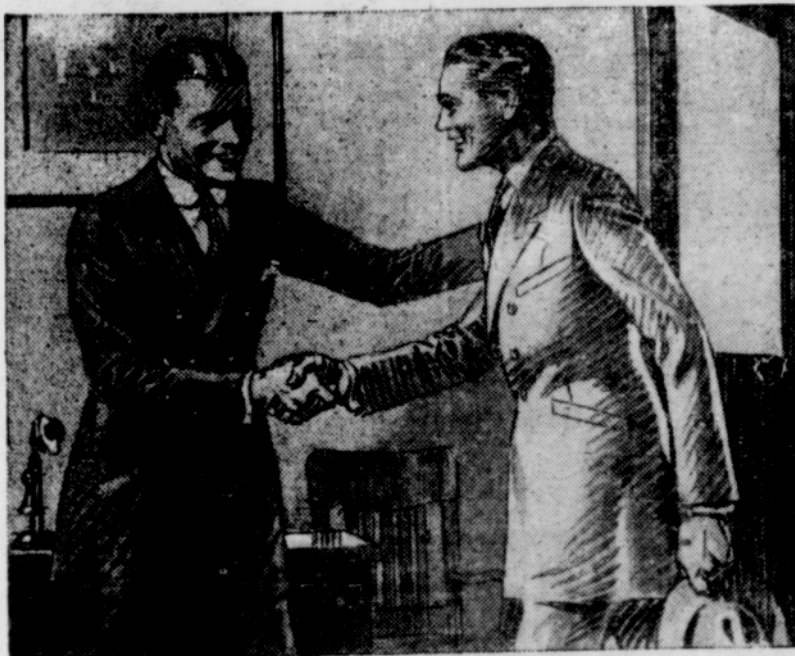

### Building and Painting Activities Around Us

Much improvement is to be noted in the city of Halsey and vicinity in the way of building and painting recently. D. S. McWilliams has had his residence painted. W. L. Norton and J. A. McWilliams have the contract to paint the residence and barn belonging to W. H. McMahan, and are now covering the house with a coat of white. B. M. Bond and Mrs. M. C. Bond have let the contract for the painting of their homes, work to begin soon, and the R. M. Bond farm house and barn are also to be painted. The unpainted front of the opera house has also been brightened up with a coat of white. L. E. Walton will commence soon to remodel his residence, planning to make a modern home out of it, while E. B. Penland is improving the front of his house by the erection of a new porch. This speaks well for the community and is a beginning of the "Clean up, paint up" movement which we hope will be furthered by other of our good citizens. In other words, make Halsey shine.

### Muddy Bridge Completed

The new bridge across Muddy on the Peoria road is again open for travel. This is a good and substantial structure and will be a great improvement over the old one which had served for a term of about fifty years.

The new bridge is wider and a much more substantial piece of work. Mr. Butler, the contractor, has progressed with the work in a very satisfactory manner and the residents in that vicinity are very much pleased with the improvement.

### Oregon Short Cuts

(From The Oregon Farmer)

It is reported that the latest importation of Jerseys from the Island of Jersey by Harry West of Scappoose is on the way to America. It is reported that there are 45 animals, two of which are bulls.

The construction of a 280-foot dam and a sufficient number of feeding ponds to more than double the capacity of the commercial salmon hatchery on the north Umpqua will start at once, according to a Roseburg report.

More than 20 hens at the Oregon experiment station made individual records of more than 800 eggs in four years, which was the record of a Kentucky hen said to be the world's champion. Records of the station showed that one of these famous Oregon Agricultural College hens laid 950 eggs in the four-year period. More egg-laying records are held by hens in the Oregon station than in any other station in the world, so far as can be determined.

Of the twenty-two fruit districts in the Oregon Growers' Cooperative association the Salem district leads in prunes, with 3600 acres, according to a report prepared by the organization. The Amity district leads in walnuts, with 296 acres. Medford is first in apple acreage, with a total of 2053 acres. Medford also leads in the production of pears, having 3710 acres. The Dalles district signed up 345 acres of cherries, while Amity had 281 acres. Salem is the principal berry district in the association, with 687 acres.

### Paving Operations To Begin Soon

At a meeting of the state highway commission to be held in Portland on the 28th of July bids for the improvement of approximately seventy miles of road will be considered. Among these projects we note the paving of 7.5 miles of the Pacific Highway between Shedd and Halsey. This confirms the report that the grade between these two towns is in the best condition of any on the highway south of Albany and will be in condition for paving soon after the graders are through with their work, as it is the first section of the new grade for which bids for paving have been asked. This will be good news to the people of this vicinity, as it will be a start in the paving of the Highway between Halsey and Albany, and with the projected rocking of much more of the road will make winter traveling much better than it has been in the past, and promises with the coming of another year and the consequent settling of the new grades a completed Highway through Linn county.
