Land Near Halsey To Be Drained

Work will commence on July 25, on a drainage project north and east of Halsey, whereby several thousand acres of land that has heretofore been practically valueless will be reclaimed. County Agent Heyman met with those interested in this project last week and reports that by the deepening and widening of the slough running through that section of the country, and the removing of debris that is now preventing the passage of water, which will be undertaken by the farmers living and having land adjacent to the slough, that this land will again be valuable for agricultural purposes. For the purpose of expediting the work it has been divided into three projects, and the upper, affecting some 1800 acres will be undertaken by W. W. Poland, William McCormick, W. H. Walton and H. C. Farmer with perhaps the assistance of other interested parties, including J. R. Wright, Otis Taylor and James Bond.

The middle project includes 460 acres and the lower project 320 acres, which will be taken care of by farmers living adjacent to these projects. The work will require but a few days time of men and teams with the possible use of dynamite on the middle section and much good will come from the work with the outlay of but a small amount of money.

Portland is Leading in Manufacturing

"Do you know," began A. E. Holcombe, "that Portland covers 70 square miles; that it is the greatest lumber manufacturing city in the world; that Oregon has 400,000,000 feet of big timber; that Portland ships more hops than any other city in the world; that Portland rivals New York in wheat shipments; that 1870 vessels entered and cleared from this port in 1920 and their aggregate tonnage was 2,772,863 tons; that in connection with these ships there was paid out in Portland more than \$12,000,000; that last year 144 shipping board vessels sailed from Portland with cargo; that these vessels carried \$9,594 tons of general cargo, 307,022 tons of wheat and flour and 217,558 tons of lumber and ties? How do I know these things? Well, I had to gather the information to put in the tourist guide which the Greater Portland Association publishes and distributes," explained Mr. Holcombe, who is one of the most confirmed members of that hotel association. —Oregonian.
