His servants said to him, Behold, there is a woman that hath a familiar spirit at En-dor. Then said the woman, Whom shall I bring up unto thee? And he said, Bring me up Samuel. And when the woman saw [the representation of] Samuel, she the king said unto her . . . What sawest thou? And the woman said

unto Saul, I saw an old man covered with a mantle. And Saul perceived [concluded] that it was Samuel. And (the representation of) Samuel said to Saul. Why hast thou dis-quieted me, to bring me up? And Saul
